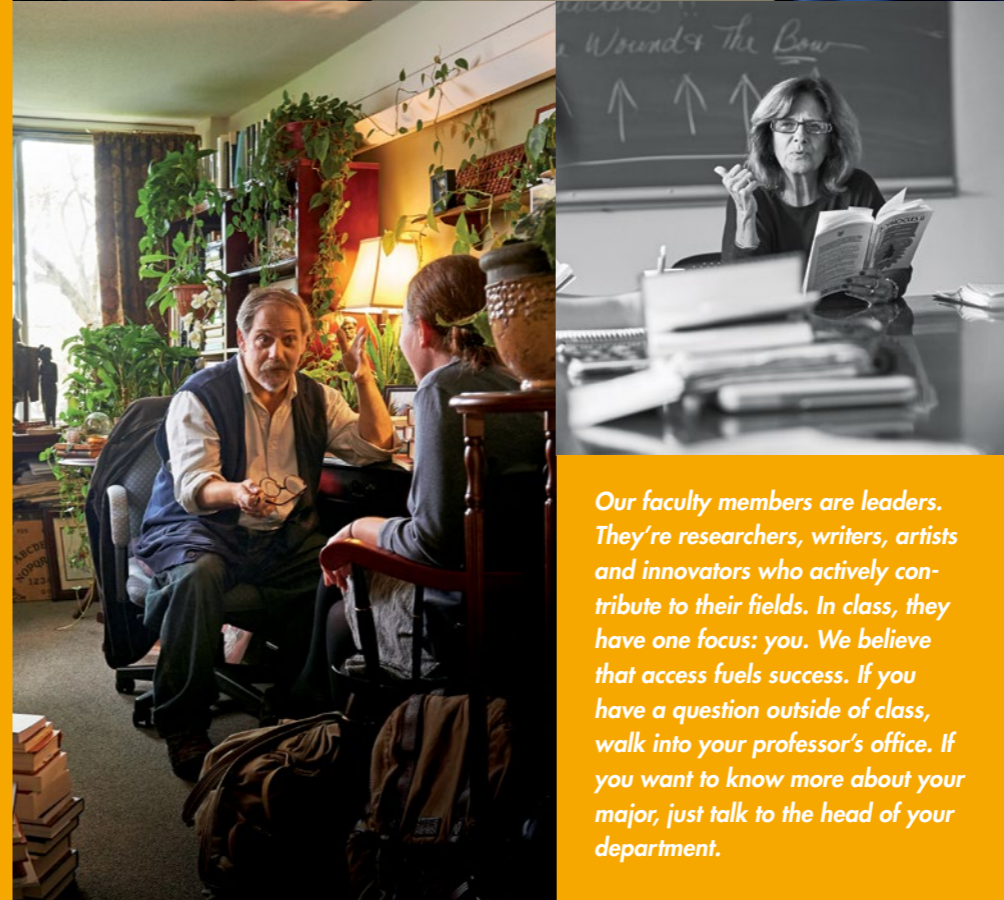

STANDARD APPLICATION TO ADELPHI

More than 370 international students from more than 45 countries are currently enrolled at Adelphi.

REQUIRED CREDENTIALS

- **A completed undergraduate application for admission.** On the application at the back of this guidebook, select “Standard Application” as your route of entry.
- **A personal statement or essay.** You are required to submit, in 500 words or less, a personal statement or essay. You may submit a report or paper you have written during the current school year if needed.
- **Academic records.** Undergraduate applicants are required to submit official or attested secondary school/university records to admissions@adelphi-international.org. One set of records should be in your native language and one set translated into English, if applicable. Undergraduate transfer applicants must submit all official transcripts and course descriptions for all institutions of higher education attended.

SAT OR TOEFL/IELTS SCORES

- **If submitting SAT:** Scores can be submitted via your official high school transcript or directly from the appropriate educational testing service.
- **If submitting TOEFL or IELTS scores:** We require a minimum score of 80 on the TOEFL iBT or 6.5 on the IELTS. Students are required to provide proof of English proficiency if English is not their native language.

For international students, the move from high school in your home country to a university in the United States can be challenging—a new language, new ways of learning and a new home. The Undergraduate Accelerator eases this transition by combining credit-bearing courses from the first year of your degree with additional academic support, instruction and cultural experiences. Together, these facets of the program combine to create a learning-centered environment that promotes academic success, active involvement in campus life and community engagement.

The Undergraduate Accelerator comprises three distinct programs:

- **EXTENDED ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (EAP)**
- **ACADEMIC ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (AAP)**
- **INTEGRATED ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (IAP)**

THE UNDERGRADUATE ACCELERATOR

The Undergraduate Accelerator program that's right for you will depend on your academic background, level of English-language proficiency and personal preferences; however, all Undergraduate Accelerator programs offer the following:

FLEXIBILITY

With the U.S. academic model, you can change majors and explore what interests you, customize your educational experience and pursue your dreams.

24/7 MULTILINGUAL SUPPORT

As an Undergraduate Accelerator student, you and your family benefit from round-the-clock support for help with all matters, large or small.

DEDICATED SUPPORT SERVICES TEAM

New students will receive support on all issues—academic and personal—as well as help with practicalities such as airport pickup, opening a bank account and mobile phone registration. Your support team will include:

AMERICAN CULTURAL EXPERIENCES

The Live, Learn, Grow course gives you the social, professional and academic skills to succeed beyond the International Accelerator. Best of all, it includes eight cultural experiences that connect you with your fellow students and your community. These experiences might include:

CAREER ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (CAP)

Through the two-year CAP, you'll enhance your employability, gain skills to advance your academic performance and access opportunities for real-world work placement, either while pursuing your degree or upon graduation.

Course Spotlight: LIVE, LEARN, GROW

Depending on your specific program track, you will take either one, two or three semesters of the Undergraduate Accelerator's signature course: Live, Learn, Grow. The course curriculum's skills-based and experiential approach is critical to your personal and professional growth and helps to ensure your success at Adelphi and beyond.

- Acquire essential information for day-to-day life at Adelphi as you navigate your immediate physical and emotional surroundings and immerse yourself deeper into the Adelphi community.
- Become a well-rounded, autonomous learner by exploring the individual nature of learning and employing active-learning exercises to demonstrate effective learning strategies.
- Share your experiences, document your growth and articulate your personal, academic and professional goals through a capstone video project, while simultaneously building technical skills through the use of mixed-media tools and techniques.

PREPARE FOR SUCCESS.

EXTENDED ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (EAP)

The Extended Accelerator Program is a three-semester program for students seeking an immersive English-learning experience. The program gives students a firsthand practical and cultural understanding of the Adelphi campus and New York area through its contextual curriculum. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

- **An immersive educational experience** with a contextual curriculum bridging language, culture and academics
- **Adelphi and the World** is a unique course designed for international students that will deepen your working knowledge of life in the United States and give you a comprehensive understanding of the local community and region.
- **Bolster your academic achievement** with turbocharged English-language instruction, tutoring, academic advising and student support.
- **Benefit from personalized English-language instruction** that's fully contextual—for example, lab-specific English-language instruction alongside your lab-science course.

ACADEMIC ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (AAP)

The Academic Accelerator Program is a two-semester program designed specifically for students who are ready to succeed in immersive English-speaking classrooms, but who also want the benefit of English-language and student support that will help them thrive. The program curriculum offers a balance of University-wide and AAP-exclusive courses, with English-language course supplements that equip students with the practical, subject-specific vocabulary and skills they need to excel in their course work. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

- **With just the right amount of support** when you need it, the Advanced Accelerator Program features a curriculum designed to accommodate your academic and English-language needs.
- **English-language** instruction designed around your social and academic needs; for example, you will be prepared specifically for the classes you will take, such as algebra and U.S. history
- **Credit-bearing**, so you can earn a full freshman year's worth of credits while taking courses tailored to your needs as an international student, helping you achieve your academic and career goals
- **Integrated with open and closed courses**, so you'll be in some classes with U.S. students and others with your designated International Accelerator cohort

The program features a robust advising and mentorship component, as well as priority access to the most exclusive, in-demand courses. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

You'll enhance your employability, gain skills to advance your academic performance and access opportunities for real-world work placement either while pursuing your degree or upon graduation.

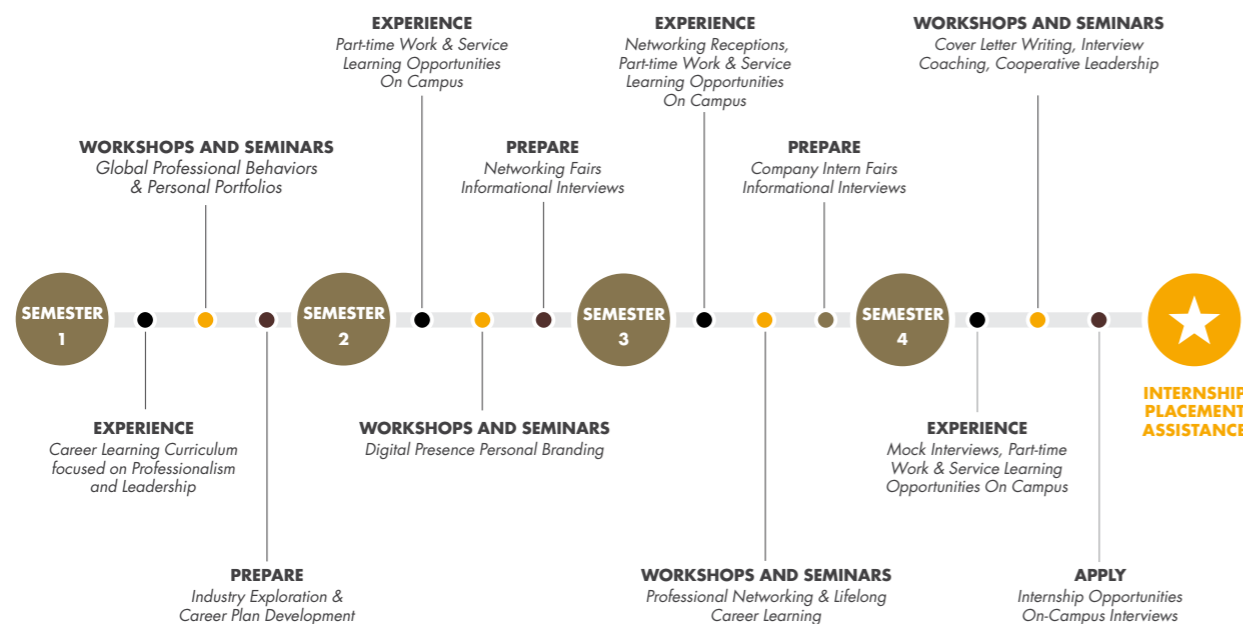
The Adelphi Career Accelerator Program takes two years to complete and is tailored to the unique experience of international students. It'll help you develop the skills to stand out in a crowded global job market: you'll explore career interests, practice interviews skills, develop a powerful résumé or CV and connect with potential employers.

To be eligible for internship placement assistance, students must:

- Successfully complete all required elements of the Career Accelerator Program.
- Have at least 3.3 GPA.
- Have maintained appropriate immigration status in the U.S.

Once you begin the program, you will have access to advisors who will help you to successfully navigate these requirements.

CARMEN ORTIZ '78
U.S. Attorney for the District of Massachusetts

Ortiz is the first Hispanic and the first woman to represent the State of Massachusetts as United States attorney, supervising the prosecution of all federal crimes and litigation of all civil matters for the federal government. In 2010, Ortiz successfully led the District's first civil rights initiative, aimed at enforcement of civil rights laws and improving community outreach. She also serves on U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder's advisory committee. Among a wealth of other awards, Ortiz was named Bostonian of the Year by *The Boston Globe* in 2012.

Larson began his musical pursuits as a tuba player in middle school, but fell in love with theater at Adelphi, graduating cum laude in 1982. His original works include the lyrics, book and score for *1984* and *tick, tick... BOOM!* Most notably, Jonathan received a Pulitzer Prize for Drama and three Tony Awards for the musical *Rent*. Today, the bench from the East Village Life Café in New York City where he wrote *Rent* sits as a memorial outside the concert hall in our Performing Arts Center.

HOUSING: ADELPHI INTERNATIONAL

Adelphi International has three housing offerings, two on campus and one off campus. All housing offerings are fully furnished and include cable and Wi-Fi service, in-building laundry, air-conditioning and kitchen access.

Off Campus

Students live at the St. George Residence in prestigious Brooklyn Heights and get the best of both worlds—New York City and Adelphi University. The St. George Residence is a short subway ride from downtown Manhattan and an hour from Adelphi’s campus on the Long Island Rail Road (LIRR) via the nearby Atlantic Avenue station.

The St. George Residence is situated on the popular Brooklyn Promenade, a half-mile stretch on the waterfront with breathtaking views of the Statue of Liberty, the Manhattan skyline and the majestic Brooklyn Bridge.

The residence hall features an onsite gym facility, public iPad stations and unlimited local and long-distance phone service. Each shared double room has an en suite bathroom and includes a microwave, refrigerator and TV.

STUDENT DINING: ADELPHI INTERNATIONAL

The single food vendor for Adelphi University is Lackmann Culinary Services. You can purchase food in the UC (University Center) Café. There you can order American kitchen-style foods, a variety of pizza, ethnic foods at the Native Spice exhibition station, traditional and wrap-style sandwiches at the Wrap It Up station, burgers and chicken sandwiches at Cheeburger Cheeburger, grab-and-go packaged meals, salads and sandwiches, homemade desserts and an assortment of bottled and fountain beverages, as well as candy and snacks.

The Melt Shoppe, located outside the Center for Recreation and Sports next to Motamed Field, serves build-your-own grilled cheese sandwiches and signature melts. The Legends Juice Bar, located in the Center for Recreation and Sports, serves smoothies and bakery items. The Underground Café, located in the lower level of the Ruth S. Harley University Center, serves Starbucks coffee and mixed hot and cold coffee drinks. Post Hall is an all-you-care-to-eat location that features a deli, homestyle entrees, a salad bar, desserts, pizza, international specialties and vegetarian options. The Post Hall C-Store sells fresh produce, fresh grab-and-go sandwiches, Dunkin’ Donuts coffee and an assortment of convenience foods.

Meal plans provide an allocation of meals and Panther Dollars per semester, which can be used by swiping your student ID for à la carte food purchases. During winter break and summer semester, the UC Café will remain open, although hours may be limited.

Students living in off-campus housing will purchase a limited campus meal plan (8 meals per week) for use while on campus, in addition to buying meals and groceries in Brooklyn Heights. Students living on campus will purchase a standard meal plan (15 meals per week). All students have the ability to upgrade their meal plans to include more meals per week.

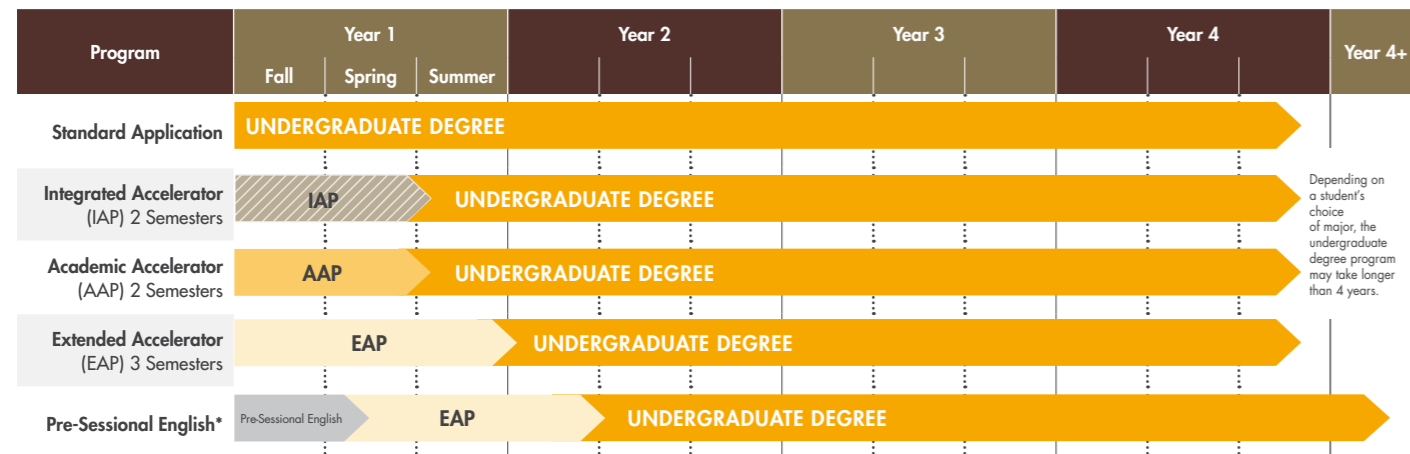

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- INTERNATIONAL ACCELERATOR PROGRAM (IAP) STUDENTS** should read these terms and conditions carefully prior to submitting an application. In addition to these terms and conditions, as students at Adelphi University (AU), all International Accelerator Program students are bound by the rules and regulations governing AU, as those may be amended from time to time. The most recent AU rules can be found here: adelphi-international.org.
- AU AND IAP RESERVE THE RIGHT TO AMEND** these terms and conditions from time to time. At all times, students will be required to comply with the then-current terms and conditions, which can be found at adelphi.edu/international.
- APPLICATION:** Students may apply to the Adelphi International Accelerator Programs (Extended, Academic or Integrated), ESL At Adelphi University, or for standard admission to AU. If you decide to apply to any of these three programs, be sure to use the application that is specific to the program you select. Each application contains terms and conditions governing the specific program and students acknowledge that they agree to the terms and conditions of the respective program by submitting an application for that program. Links to applicable applications and terms and conditions can be found here: .
- STUDENTS WHO ARE ADMITTED** to the International Accelerator Program will receive a written offer letter with details on accepting the offer, paying the program deposit and arriving on campus.
- TUITION, FEES, AND ACCOMMODATION PAYMENT:** Following payment of the deposit, students must pay the remaining outstanding balance two weeks prior to move-in. IAP has the right to amend prices due to University actions, tax increases, governmental actions or other events beyond its control.
- ACCOMMODATION AND MEAL PLAN:** All International Accelerator Program undergraduate students are required to commit to a 2-term or 3-term reservation in the approved Program housing and pay in full for these accommodations two weeks prior to move-in. Later notification of non-enrollment or not moving in may result in additional costs relating to contract cancellation. To request cancellation of the Adelphi Housing Agreement, the student must submit an Early Release Request from the Annual Housing Agreement Form (portal.adelphi.edu/documents/10932456/10988900/ResidentAgreementRelease_2014.pdf). If a cancellation is effective after the fourth week, you will not receive any rent refund (refunds will be made pro-rated through the fourth week). Students are also required to purchase an IAP-designated dining plan for two or three terms semesters as a condition of enrollment. The cost of the meal plan is non-refundable.
- HEALTH INSURANCE:** All international students studying at AU are required to be covered by health insurance that meets the U.S. Government, New York State, and AU requirements. The cost of health insurance is non-refundable.
 - At the time of their application, students are required to purchase coverage from an IAP-designated health plan as a condition of enrollment.
 - All students must submit a completed AU Immunization Form documenting proof of immunity to Measles (Rubeola), Mumps and German Measles (Rubella) [MMR], and either proof of immunization against Meningitis, or a signed waiver declining this vaccine. Mandatory Immunization Forms may be obtained through the Adelphi Health Services Center office (health.adelphi.edu/forms). Students must have submitted immunization documentation to live in program housing and register for classes.
- AIRPORT TRANSFERS:** Requests for airport transfer should be made at least 2 weeks in advance. IAP cannot guarantee a reservation for a request made less than 2 weeks in advance, however, staff will make every attempt to accommodate late requests. In the event that a flight is cancelled or delayed, students must call the emergency telephone number published in the Pre-Departure Guide to inform IAP's staff of the new arrival date and time. Please see section 21 for airport transfer cancellation policy.
- CANCELLATION, CHANGE, CURTAILMENT OR WITHDRAWAL:** Students who cancel their IAP program prior to arrival date on AU's campus may request a full refund of deposit, tuition and fees pursuant to Section 21 of these terms and conditions. After the start of the IAP program, students may be eligible for the following partial tuition refunds:
 - Fall program start: 100% of program tuition (less all fees) is refunded before August 28, 2016. Between August 29, 2016 and September 23, 2016 a declining percentage of program tuition on a scale of 70%, 50%, and 20% will be refunded. After September 23, 2016 0% of program tuition will be refunded.
 - Spring program start: 100% of program tuition (less all fees) is refunded before January 22, 2017. Between January 22, 2017 and February 17, 2017 a declining percentage of program tuition on a scale of 70%, 50%, and 20% will be refunded. After February 17, 2017 0% of program tuition will be refunded.
 - Summer program start: 100% of program tuition (less all fees) is refunded before May 30, 2017. Between May 30, 2017 and June 2, 2017 a declining percentage of program tuition on a scale of 70%, 50%, and 20% will be refunded. After June 2, 2017 0% of program tuition will be refunded.
- PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, VACATION AND ABSENCES:** Classes are normally not held on public holidays and most school facilities will be closed. Adelphi International will not make reimbursements for classes not offered.
- ABSENCES:** F1 students must comply with all applicable United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) regulations related to study on a student visa at AU, including attendance requirements. Failure to meet attendance requirements may lead to penalties, including loss of immigration status. Any student who is absent during the program or loses immigration status due to absences will not be eligible for a refund.

12. **ACADEMIC CRITERIA:** Students are accepted into the IAP with the strict understanding that progression through the IAP and successful completion of any program will require satisfactory attendance and successful attainment of specified progression grades. Students who do not meet the criteria for successful completion will not be allowed to proceed. Students may be offered advice on suitable alternative options, which may or may not include retaking courses or repeating certain courses. These alternative options may involve additional time and costs, including tuition and accommodation fees.
13. **ACADEMIC RESOURCES:** all books and learning materials need to be purchased by IAP students upon arrival at AU.
14. **STUDENT CONDUCT:** All IAP students are required to follow AU's policies, rules, and regulations. Any student who commits a criminal offense, violates campus rules, has poor attendance, or fails to meet program requirements may be expelled or suspended. No refund will be given in cases of suspension or expulsion. Students are responsible for understanding and complying with this Code of Conduct. The Office of Student Conduct and Community Standards and the behavioral intervention process are committed to providing experiences, processes and resources that support the advancement of students' principled decision making, responsible citizenship and adherence to AU's core values and principles; and which contribute to an environment that supports the health and safety of members so that they may reach academic goals without unnecessary impediments.
15. **REFUNDS:** IAP will only make refunds in U.S. dollars, minus bank transfer and processing fees, and will make such refunds in the manner in which IAP was originally paid and to the account of the party or parties who made such payment(s). All refunds will be made to eligible parties within 45 days of written notice.
16. **GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES, APPEALS OR COMPLAINTS:** Students must follow the University policy and procedures for dealing with student complaints, grievances and appeals in a constructive and timely manner. More information is available here: operations.adelphi.edu/policies.

18. **PHOTOGRAPHY, FILMING AND SOUND RECORDING:** Adelphi International or its representatives, affiliates, successors and related companies may arrange to photograph or shoot video footage of students for purposes of advertising, public relations, and/or promotion in any medium throughout the world, including on social media sites and on the internet. Any student who does not wish to participate should advise us in writing and state at the time of the photography or video shooting the wish not to participate. By accepting these terms and conditions you are indicating your consent to use these photographs or video footage without further consent or notifications unless you follow the above opt-out requirements.
19. **FORCE MAJEURE:** AU and IAP will not be liable in cases where AU and/or IAP is unable to fulfill any services because of fire, natural disaster, national emergency, act of government, acts of war or terrorism, failure of suppliers or subcontractors, labor disputes or any other reasons which are beyond AU's or IAP's control.
20. **F-1 STUDENT STATUS IN THE US:** In order to maintain proper F-1 status, students must comply with all applicable Federal regulations related to study in the United States, including pursuit of a full course of study. Students who fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress are in jeopardy of losing immigration status. Any violation of student status will be reported in the SEVIS database shared by AU and the Department of Homeland Security. Information collected by AU and the IAP which personally identifies a student and information regarding a student's course progress may be shared with Department of Homeland Security, AU and accrediting agencies, designated authorities, students' parents, AU and IAP staff and agents. This information may include personal and contact details, course enrollment details and changes, and circumstances of any suspected breach by the student of any AU or IAP policies and/or any DHS rules or regulations.
21. **CANCELLATION:** 'Cancellation Period' refers to the period up to the start date of the first course you are attending. Cancellations must be made during the Cancellation Period in writing and in these cases, provided the student never attends, 100% of the tuition and accommodation fees will be refunded. In all cases, the deposit and any other service charges (e.g. accommodation fee, airport transfer fee, medical insurance, campus fee, program supplement fee, etc.) are non-refundable. Please see Section 6 of these terms and conditions for accommodation cancellation policy and Section 9 for cancellations after the Cancellation Period. Cancellations made prior to the course start date but after arrival in the US on an AU- issued Form I-20 will be governed under standard AU tuition, fees, and accommodation cancellation policy.

Any legal suit, action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right or issues arising out of or related to these terms and conditions, shall be brought exclusively in the United States Federal Court for the Eastern District of New York (if it has or can acquire jurisdiction) or New York State Supreme Court, Nassau County. By signing these terms and conditions, the student consents to and accepts the jurisdictions of such courts for the purpose of any such action or proceeding and agree to waive any objection to venue being laid therein.
23. **STUDENTS MUST BE 16 YEARS OLD BY THE MOVE-IN DATE** (August 22, 2016 for fall intake; January 16, 2017 for spring intake; May 24, 2017 for summer intake) in order to participate in the program. Students who are over the age of 16 but under the age of 18 will be required to obtain the signature and consent of a parent or guardian before they are able to participate in the program.
24. **IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 (FERPA),** the undersigned student hereby permits AU to disclose personally identifiable information, including all educational records to the International Accelerator Program, its operator, its parent Shorelight Education, LLC, and their group companies. The undersigned hereby also grants AU and the IAP permission to provide the student's parent(s), guardian(s), sponsor(s), scholarship bodies, and recruiter(s) with information pertaining to their application, academic progress, results, attendance, and disciplinary matters. These permissions will remain in effect during the undersigned student's tenure at IAP and AU.
