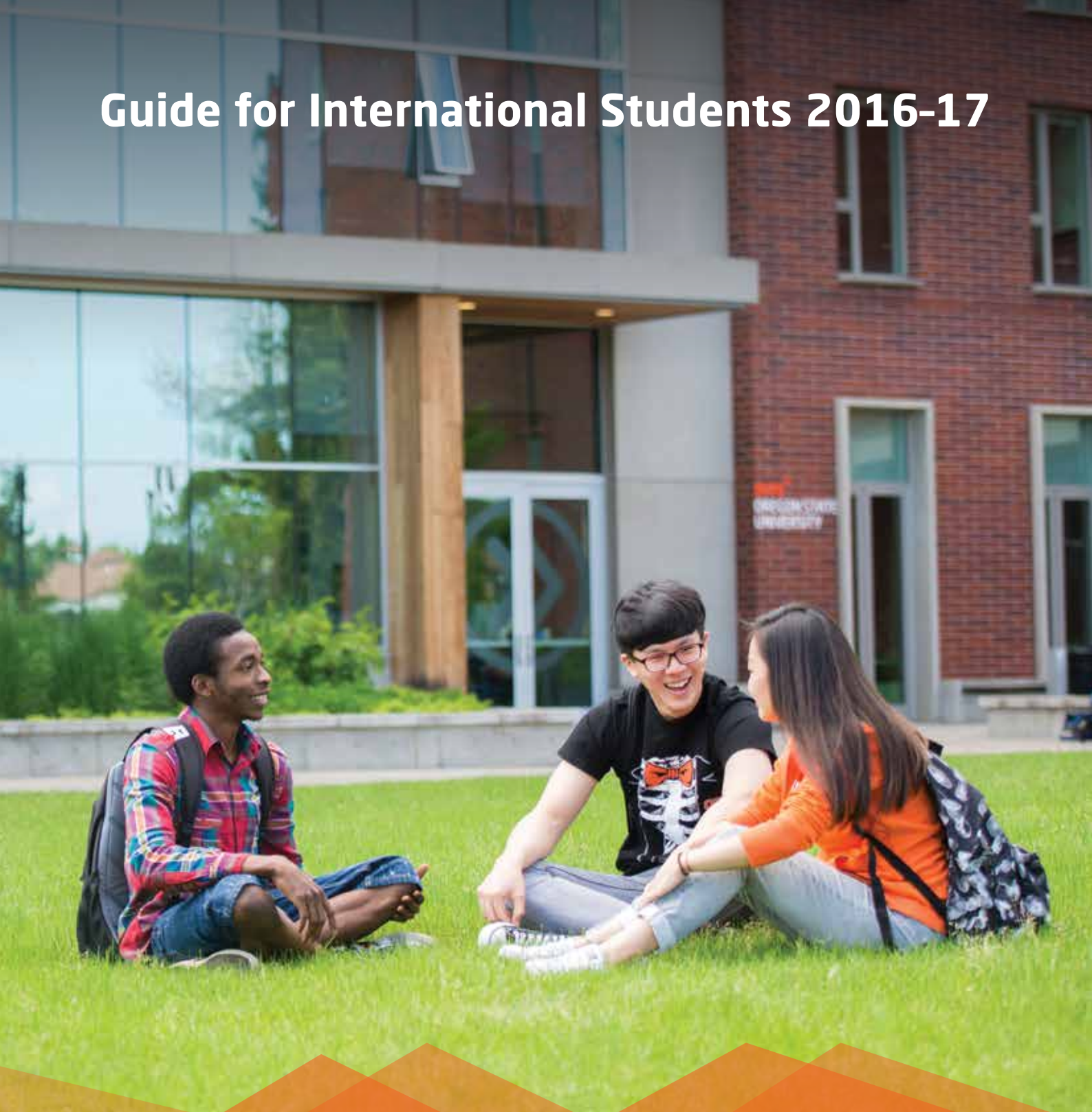

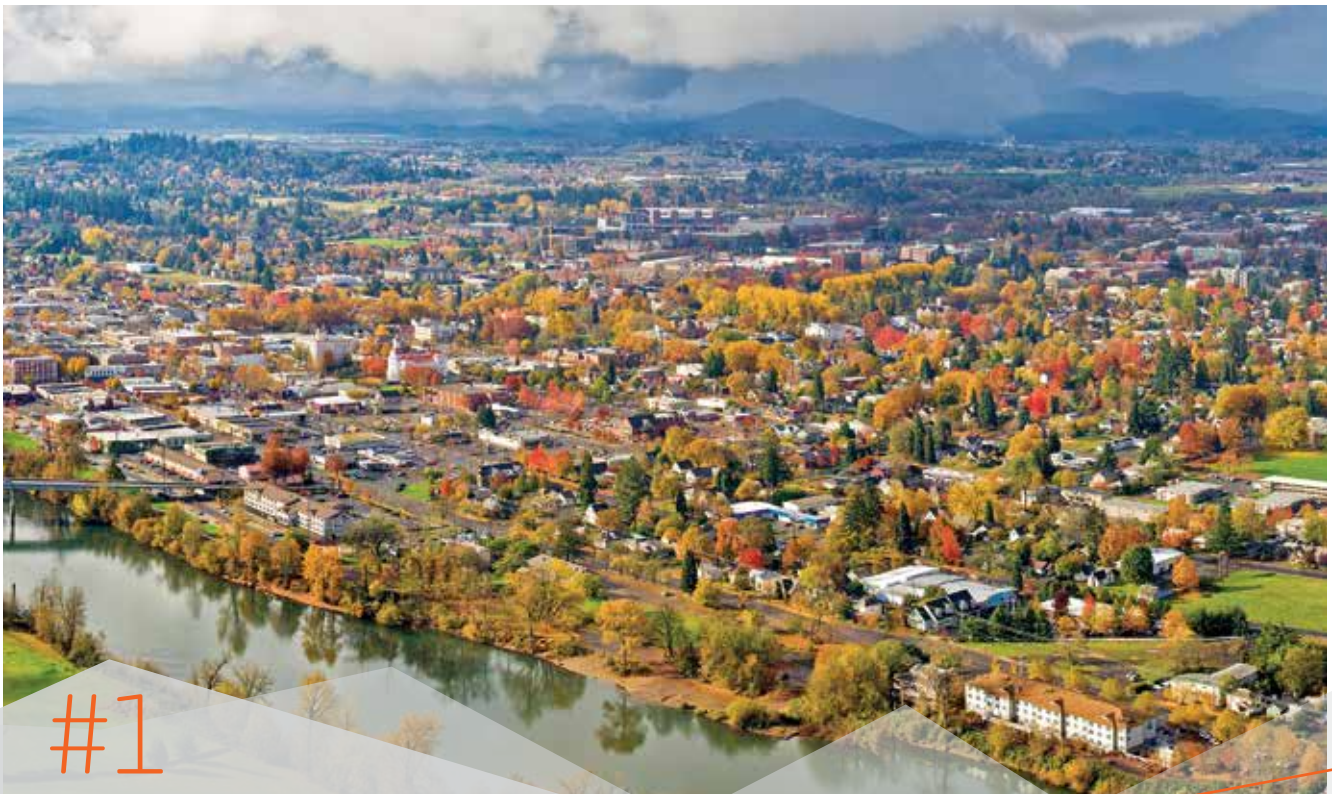

The State

OSU for International Students

Oregon State University is dedicated to the success and well-being of our students. We offer a variety of programs for international students providing them with the essential support they need to be successful in an American university.

A Premier Public Research University

Founded in 1868, Oregon State University is one of only two universities in the United States to have Land Grant, Sea Grant, Space Grant and Sun Grant designations. This means OSU is involved with world-changing research in all four areas, something very unique among American universities.

Oregon State is among the nation's leading research institutions in a range of fields, including forestry, climate change, wave energy, sustainable food systems, computer science, environmental science, chemical and mechanical engineering and robotics.

Paths for International Students

Direct Entry

Students who meet the specified language and academic criteria may apply directly to Oregon State University. Students who do not meet these requirements are encouraged to apply to our Pathway and English language programs.

Undergraduate Pathway Programs

Our undergraduate Pathway programs combine intensive language study, academic skills development and academic course work in a carefully constructed program designed to move students successfully through the first year of an undergraduate degree program.

Graduate Pathway Programs

The Graduate Pathway program is a pre-master's program that provides international students a direct path to various graduate degrees at the university. The program gives students the academic foundation, essential language skills and GMAT/GRE test preparation to successfully move on to a master's degree program.

English Language Program

Students can also choose from a range of English language programs to help meet their personal and professional goals. There are many opportunities through classroom instruction and outside of the classroom to engage with other domestic and international students.

OSU-Cascades

Small Campus Feel – Big University Resources

Oregon State University also has a campus in Bend, Oregon, in a region known for rugged beauty, sunny skies and unlimited outdoor recreational opportunities. At the OSU-Cascades campus, students find the advantages of a premier research university in a personalized, small-campus environment. It is a great option for international students looking for a

smaller learning environment. Here, you can experience American culture in a vibrant small city, explore the great outdoors and pursue a degree with the excellent resources of Oregon State University. With just over 1,000 students, international students quickly find themselves immersed in the campus community as well as in the region's local culture.

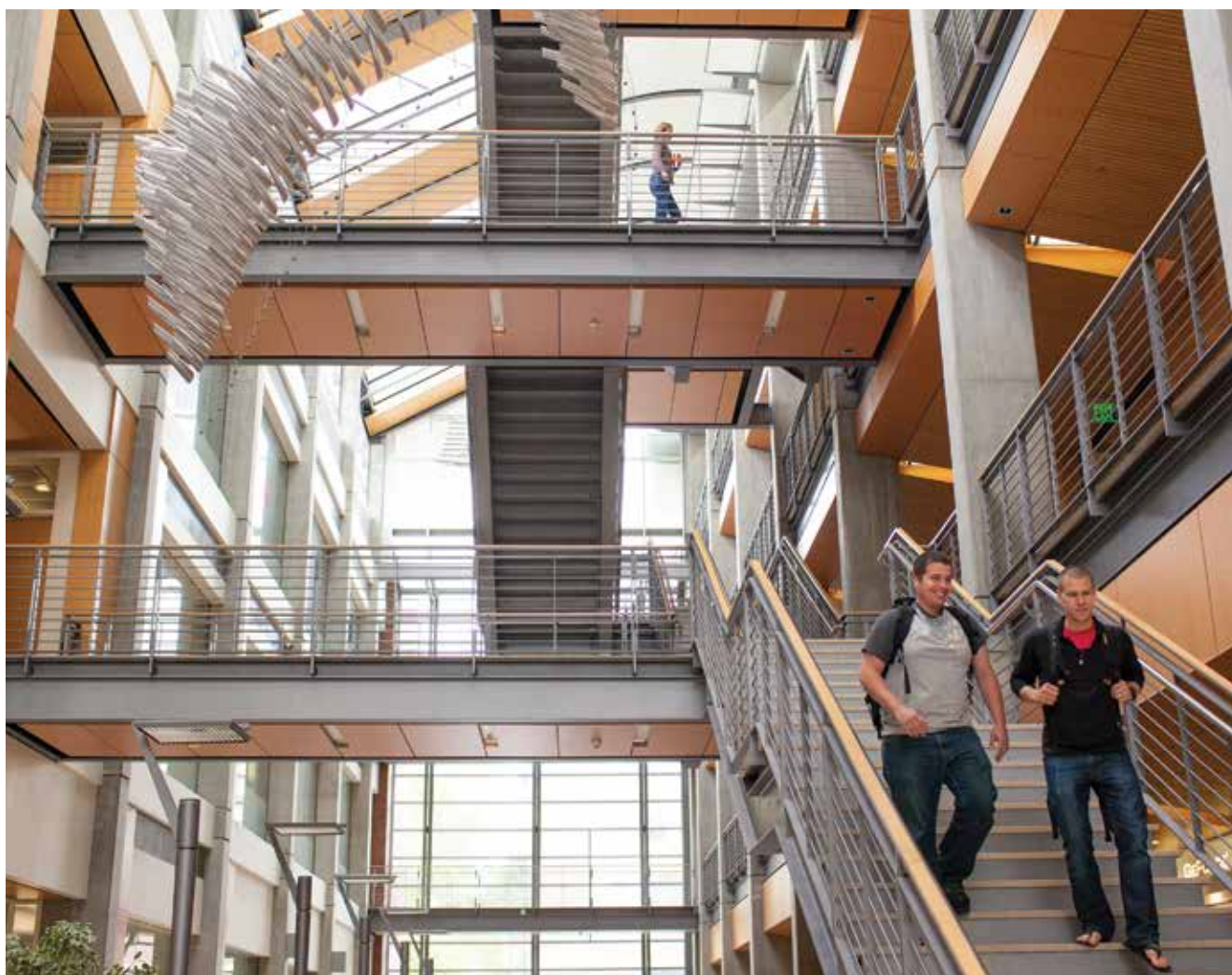

The UHC community is diverse, supportive and active in the university and the community. The UHC values and embraces a global perspective and welcomes students from all countries and backgrounds. Each year, undergraduate Pathway students have successfully competed to join the UHC.

The UHC Offers:

- Challenging and creative curricula for students of all majors
- Unique classes, typically limited to 12-20 students
- OSU's top professors, often chosen by UHC students
- One-on-one mentoring by faculty members
- An undergraduate thesis where students can pursue their academic and research interests

Admission to the UHC is competitive. Applicants meeting the minimum academic criteria will also be evaluated on their responses to the essay portion of the UHC application and on their non-academic activities and contributions to their communities.

Undergraduate Direct Entry

OSU provides direct admission to the university for international first-year and transfer students. Applicants must meet minimum English language proficiency and GPA requirements. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis with four entry dates.

1. Apply for Admission

Before starting your application make sure you meet our admissions requirements on page 19.

To apply visit: intlapps.oregonstate.edu

2. Submit Transcripts and Test Scores

- Send your official transcripts from all secondary and post-secondary institutions attended.
- In order to expedite application processing, you can submit unofficial copies of transcripts until official transcripts arrive.
- Please ensure that all documents issued in languages other than English are accompanied by a certified English translation.

3. Submit Immigration Documents

- A copy of your passport
- A financial statement that shows funding support based on the estimated cost of attendance for one academic year
- An OSU Affidavit of Support

4. Check Your Application Status

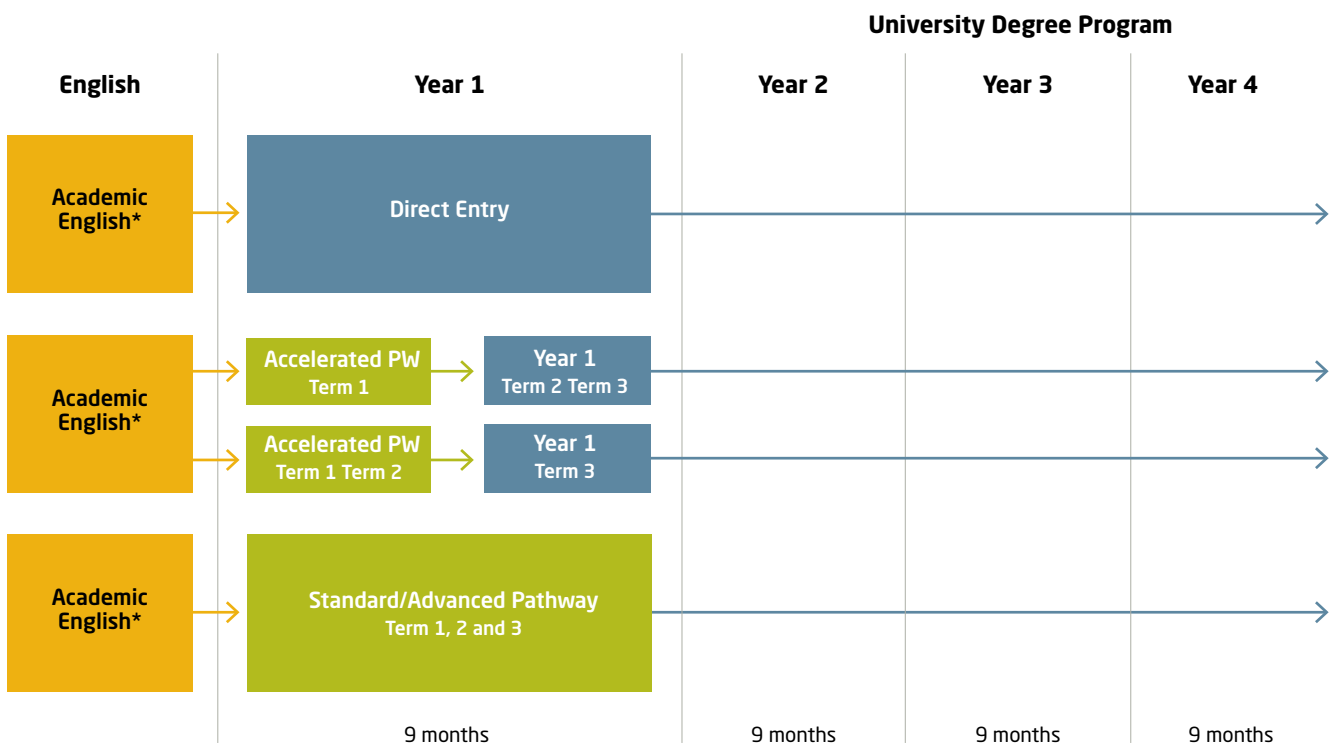

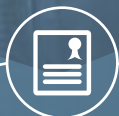

The Graduate Pathway program is a pre-master's or pre-doctorate (only for Comparative Health Science Pathway) program that provides international students a direct path to various graduate degrees at the university. The program gives students the academic foundation, essential language skills and GMAT/GRE test preparation to successfully move on to a master's or doctoral degree.

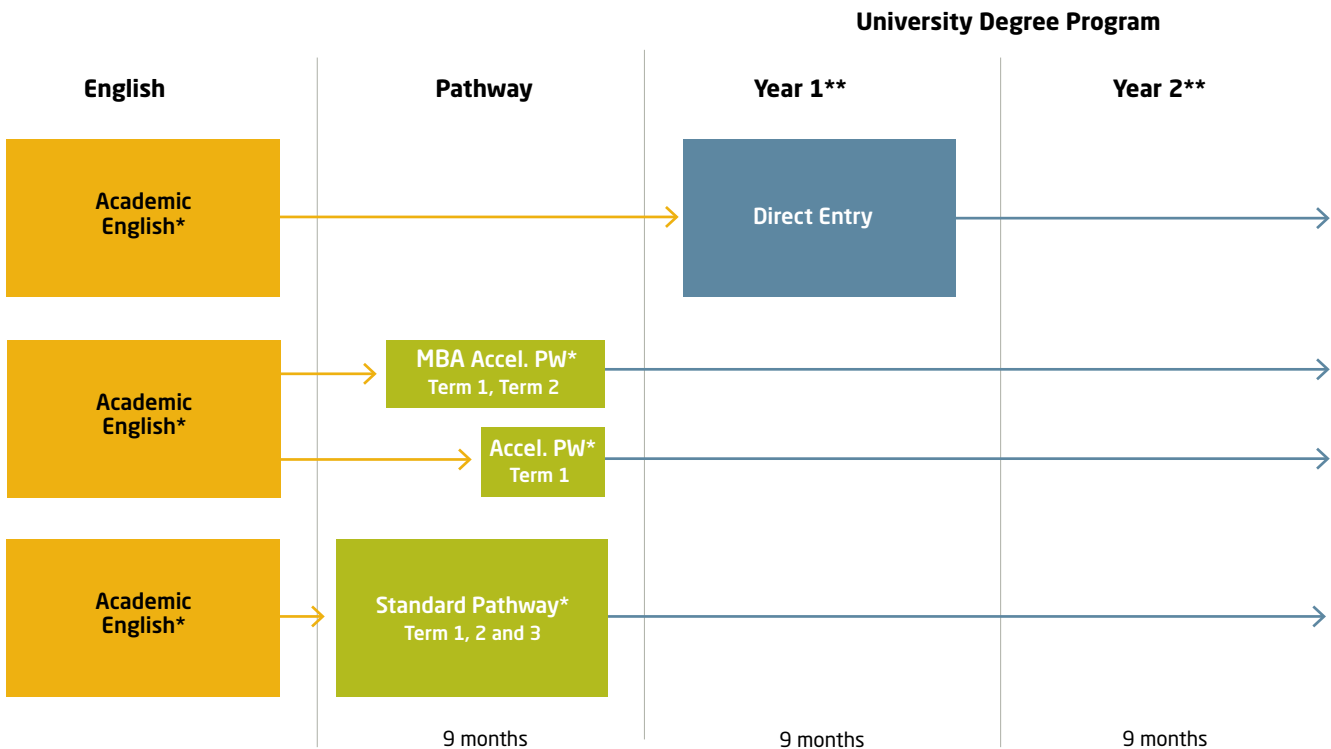

Program Benefits

Pathway students receive the highest level of support during their transition abroad, making it an ideal choice for international students who are driven to achieve high academic goals. Other benefits include:

- Assured progression to an OSU graduate program (subject to successful completion of Pathway program and any additional requirements)
- Up to 40 hours of TOEFL test preparation and GMAT/GRE preparation
- Dedicated academic advisor and progression advisor to help facilitate transition to the university
- Pathway peer tutors available to provide additional academic support
- Noncompetitive entry

TOEFL, GMAT and GRE PREP

TOEFL, GMAT and GRE test preparation are built into the Graduate Pathway program curriculum. Students receive up to 40 hours of test preparation throughout the duration of the program. Our test preparation courses are taught by experienced OSU instructors and focus on skills-based language development and test-taking skills which include the use of practice tests and individual feedback on performance. We also provide self-study materials, available in our learning center.

Graduate Pathway Programs

MBA

The Graduate Pathway for MBA is designed to provide a route and academic foundation for students wanting to pursue an MBA degree. The MBA Pathway and the MBA program combined will take two to three years to complete depending on course load and specialization options.

About the OSU MBA

The OSU MBA program challenges students with a rigorous and hands-on experience. You'll be expected to jump in, collaborate with your peers and put real-world projects into motion. The MBA program will also give you an understanding of how sustainable business meets economic, social and environmental needs without compromising the future of any of them. Sustainability is woven into our curriculum; when you leave, you'll be able to make a positive impact on the world. Please refer to business.oregonstate.edu/mba for more information about tracks and course of study.

Students who wish to earn an MBA at OSU must complete between 60-88 credit hours, which includes 15 credits of foundational course work and 45-73 credits of MBA core and specialization classes. Students in the INTO OSU Pathway program will enroll in the foundation courses and will have the opportunity to earn up to 15 credits toward their MBA degree while in the Pathway.

The Integrated Business Project

The OSU MBA supplements rigorous classroom instruction with practical, hands-on opportunities to learn by doing. This model gives you both the knowledge and the experience you need to lead in an increasingly complex and interconnected business environment. As an MBA student at OSU, you will work collaboratively in multi-cultural, interdisciplinary teams and will have the opportunity to complete an integrated business project in your chosen field of study.

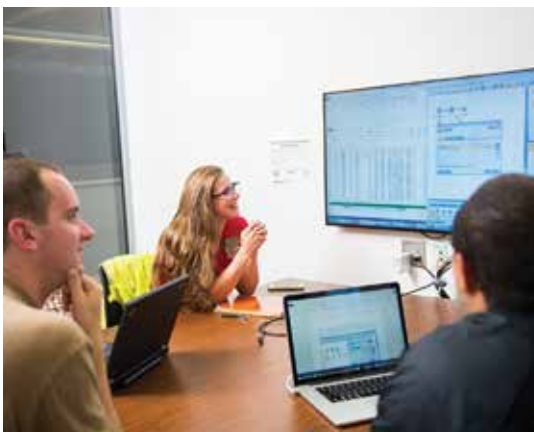

Math Placement for MBA Pathway Students

All Graduate Pathway MBA students are required to take the OSU Math Placement Test during orientation week. This test will place you in the most suitable math class. If you place at a lower level than MTH 245, you may require additional terms of study.

In order to prepare you for the MBA Graduate Pathway, you will have the opportunity to take the free, online OSU Math Placement Test in your home country. You can take the test in the six-month period before your Graduate MBA Pathway begins. After taking the test, you will have access to free, online math study materials for a period of six months. These materials are specifically designed to help you increase your math skills.

If you are completing the INTO OSU Academic English program prior to the MBA Pathway, you will have the opportunity to take the OSU Math Placement Test in the INTO OSU Center. If necessary, you will then be able to take a math course that will help you to reach the required math level by the time you start the MBA Pathway.

General English

Program Description

The General English program consists of five-week sessions designed for students of all levels of English who want to develop communication skills in a variety of social and professional situations while learning about American culture.

Program Highlights

- English instruction for personal or employment motives
- Curriculum tied to the Common European Framework of Reference
- Academic advising throughout the program
- Small classes of 18-20 students
- Use of a fully-equipped learning center with state-of-the-art technology
- Students up to Level 3 have in-class conversation practice with OSU students
- Varied electives such as English through Photography and English through Volunteering
- Many opportunities for learning outside the classroom, including field trips both on campus and in the community

Program Outcomes

The General English program allows students to tailor their program to suit their personal, professional and academic goals. General English students will be able to:

- Improve general language proficiency in listening, speaking, vocabulary, reading and writing
- Expand career prospects by improving English language proficiency
- Develop conversation skills for real-world situations such as greeting, initiating a conversation, turn-taking, interrupting, asking for information
- Read and understand schedules, signs, ads and other authentic materials
- Understand basic cultural values and behaviors of Americans in order to interact appropriately
- Have the opportunity to interact with native speakers
- Progress to Academic English for further study at OSU

College Year Abroad

College Year Abroad is a long-term General English program for students who want to fully experience an American university. As with regular General English students, College Year Abroad students have access to all the same resources and amenities as all other university students including:

- Access to Dixon Recreation Center (on-campus gym facility)
- Access to OSU's Valley Library
- Participation in OSU clubs and activities
- Free tickets to OSU athletic events
- Use of a fully-equipped Learning Center with state-of-the-art technology
- Access to the student health center and other student welfare resources on campus

In addition, many College Year Abroad and General English students who choose shared on-campus housing are placed with American roommates, further enhancing their study abroad experience in America. With American roommates, and conversation groups/social programs organized by INTO OSU, students are more likely to have a successful experience integrating to the campus community and American lifestyle.

Study Abroad with English

Our Study Abroad with English program allows non-degree-seeking international students to study at OSU while earning college credits.

Program Description

Study Abroad with English combines Academic English language study with the chance to experience undergraduate courses at OSU. This unique program allows students to earn college credits in their field of interest without having to enroll in a long-term degree program. The length of the program will vary depending on a student's needs. The program can be customized for different levels of English and for specific academic interests.

With prior approval from a student's home university, the academic courses studied at OSU can be used to gain credits toward an undergraduate degree in his or her home country. Earned credits may also be applied to a degree program with admission to OSU.

Part 1

Part 1 includes full-time intensive study in the Academic English program to the level required for taking credit courses at OSU. This intensive program starts at four different entry points during the year, in fall, winter, spring and summer.

Part 2

Students are able to select from OSU undergraduate courses and study alongside domestic and international students while continuing to take English language classes as well.

Part 3

Students will be part of the Visiting International Student Program. Please refer to page 49 for more information and for start dates.

Visiting International Student Program

Our Visiting International Student Program is designed for international students looking to study Liberal Arts abroad for one or more terms at a US university.

Program Description

The Visiting International Student Program is designed for students who want one or more terms of study abroad experience at a top US university. The program provides students with a classic American university experience while taking a variety of credit-bearing classes. Students will have access to all the support services available at the university and INTO OSU, including exceptional one-on-one tutoring, social and cultural trips and more. Intensive English courses are available but are not a mandatory part of the program.

Course Selection

INTO OSU has partnered with the OSU College of Liberal Arts to make a wide range of courses available to VISIP students. A selection of available courses is listed below. Other courses may be available in the College of Liberal Arts by special arrangement. Departmental approval is required for enrollment in courses outside the College of Liberal Arts.

Transferring Courses

Courses taken are transferable in accordance with articulation policies of the student's home university. All courses taken as part of the Visiting International Student Program are credit-bearing (except intensive English courses, if selected). Students should coordinate with their home university to ensure courses taken through VISIP are transferable to their degree.

Academic Success

International students at OSU are highly successful. There are many academic support resources at OSU which can be tailored to meet the needs of individual students.

Orientation

Orientation is your first step toward a successful academic career at OSU. Directly admitted students will receive information in advance about OSU Online Academic Advising and Registration, also called START. All other students will be tested according to their program of study and registered into classes during orientation. You will have the opportunity to take care of other steps, such as obtaining an OSU ID card, completing any remaining immunization requirements, becoming familiar with the campus and Corvallis, as well as learning about the requirements of your student visa. Orientation is required for all new students.

First Year Experience

The First Year Experience at OSU combines intensive academic advising and special courses to help full-time, first-year students succeed. FYE requires that students live on campus as data shows students who live on campus in residence halls typically earn higher grades than those who live off campus.

Tutors and One-on-one Support

You can make appointments or drop in for help with classes and assignments in a variety of subjects and locations. Specialized assistance is available for writing, reading, math, physics, chemistry, as well as an online writing lab. Assistance is available to learn effective study skills, time management and test-taking strategies. There are several locations where you can get support:

- Academic Success Center
- Writing Center
- Collaborative Learning Center
- Math Learning Center

Valley Library

The Valley Library is open 24 hours, Sunday through Friday. Saturday hours are 10 am to 10 pm. You can receive help with computer issues, use private and group study spaces and check out laptops and e-readers. There also are 100+ computers, printers and copiers. Make sure to see the 3D printers too.

Computers and Online Resources

Student Computing Facilities offer more than 100 Macs and PCs equipped with the latest software in an open lab setting. Scanners, laser printing, video editing and over 100 computer programs are provided.

Technology Support Services

Computer consultants are available by phone, email or online through the OSU help desk.

University Student Services

All international students have full access to the resources, services and amenities offered at Oregon State University.

Health Services

There are two medical clinics on campus where students can see a doctor or nurse. Many, but not all, consultations will be covered by the international student health insurance plan. The services available on campus include: physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nutrition consultations, acupuncture, chiropractors, x-rays and more. OSU Health Services also support students' mental health and well-being through counseling, group conversations and presentations on topics such as stress management and healthy relationships. Insurance

The health insurance system in the US is very complicated, but OSU students have access to a quality insurance plan at a reasonable cost. The OSU International Student Health Plan will be automatically added to your student account after arrival unless proof of suitable alternative coverage is provided. Some sponsor insurance policies may be an acceptable alternative to the OSU policy. To learn more about the insurance plan, please visit: studenthealth.oregonstate.edu/internationalplan

While some services may be covered 100%, this is not true for all services; you should study the details of your health plan carefully. Keep in mind that you will often have to pay a partial cost of medical services yourself, even if you have an insurance policy.

Visa and Immigration Support

International Student Advising and Services provides advising on immigration and visa regulations, as well as general advising on academic or personal issues and university policies. They can also direct students to the appropriate university offices or resources in the community for support.

Public Safety

The Department of Public Safety and Oregon State Police provide a safe campus for OSU students, faculty, staff and visitors. State troopers and public safety officers patrol the campus 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Religious and Spiritual Life

OSU is a place which welcomes diversity, including religious or cultural traditions. There are "quiet spaces" all over campus provided for students to practice their religion or enjoy quiet reflection outside of any particular faith. In addition to accommodations for dietary needs, you also will find foot washing stations, and some bathrooms that have been modified to allow for other cultural practices. If you have a question about how you will be able to practice your religion, please ask.

First-year students who enroll in an undergraduate degree-seeking program at Oregon State University within one year of high school graduation, regardless of class standing, must live on campus for the full academic year (fall, winter and spring terms). This includes all students with Undergraduate Pathway in their study plan. Spaces are guaranteed for first-year students.

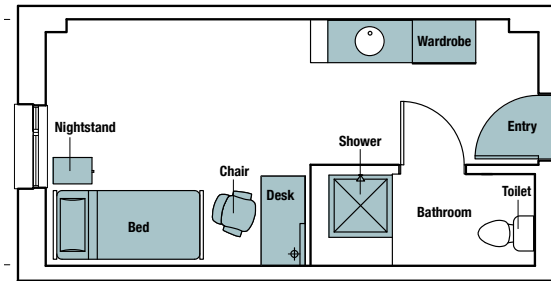

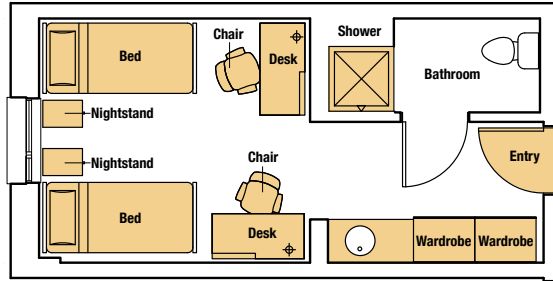

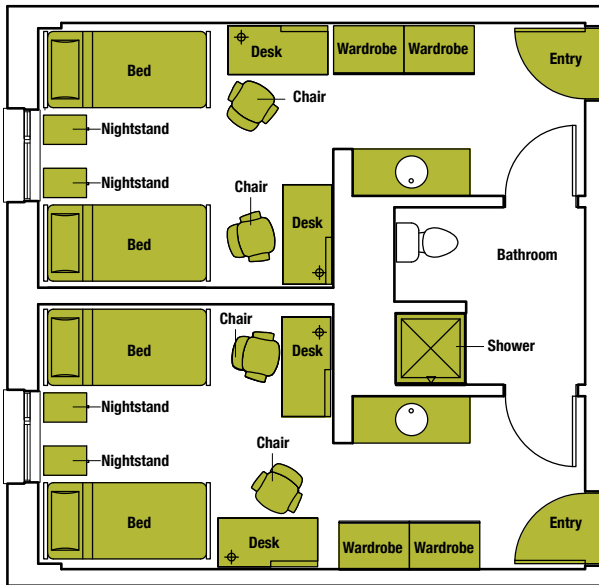
Housing Floor Plans



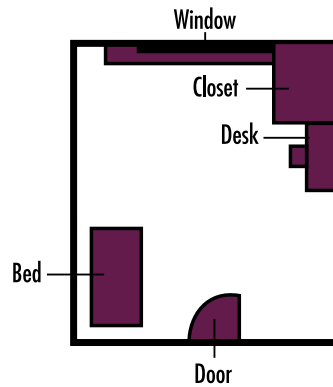
▲ On-Campus: Single room with private bathroom*



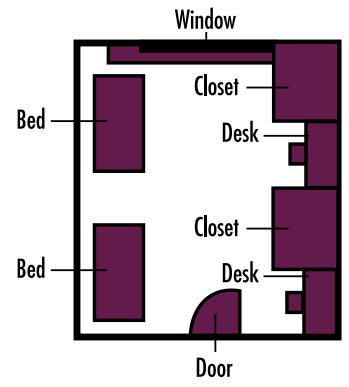
▲ On-Campus: Double room with private bathroom*

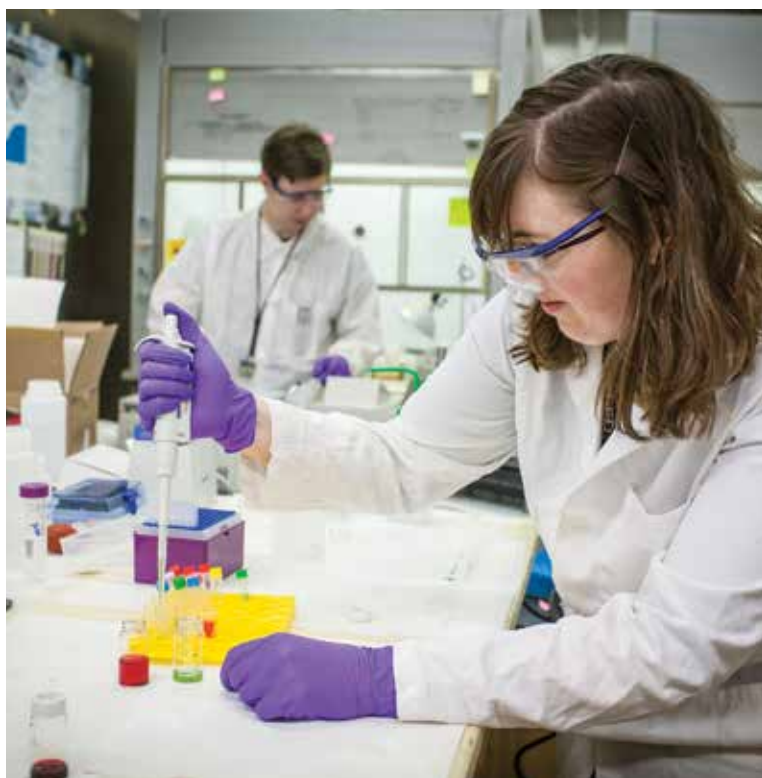

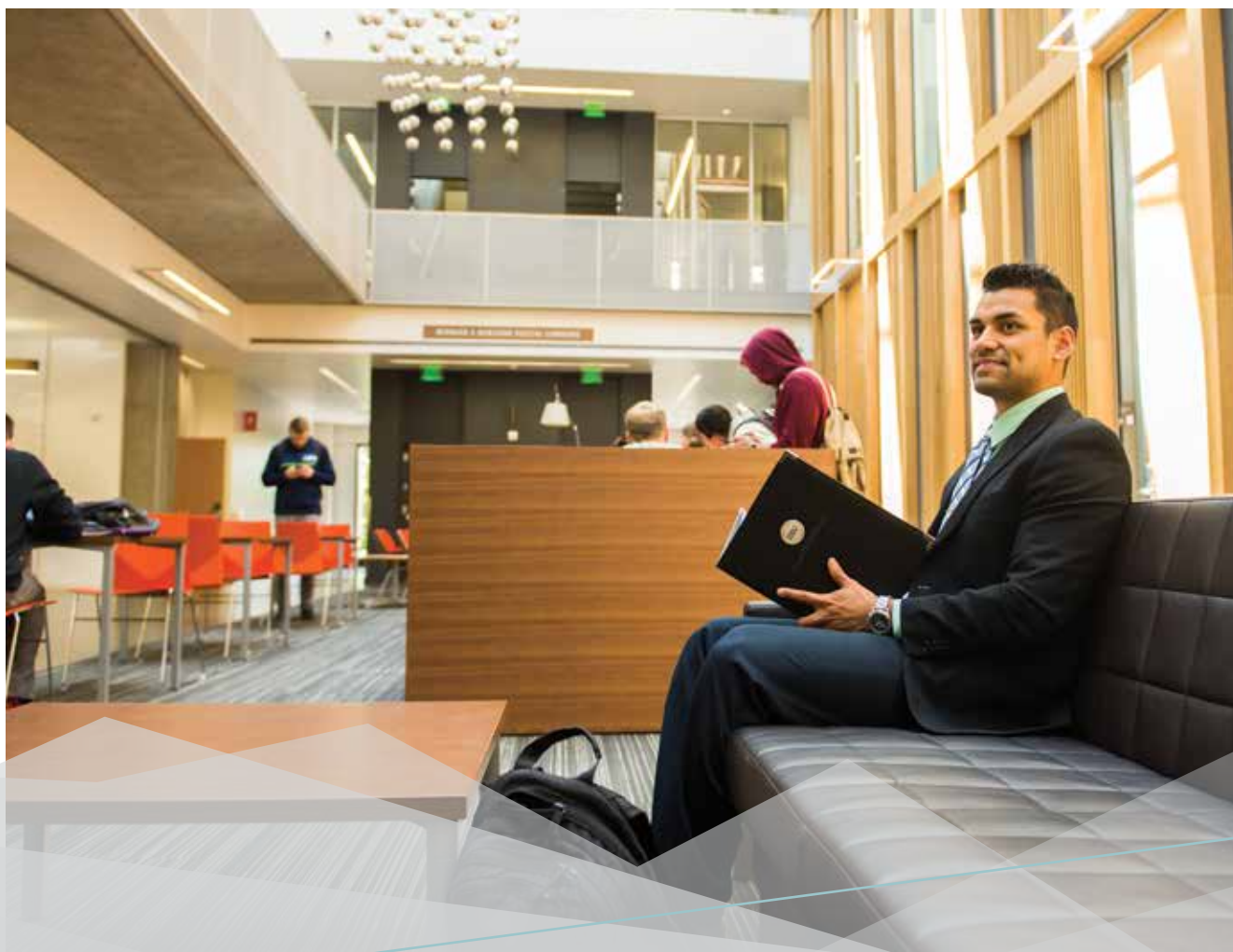

Work While Studying

Degree-seeking international students on F-1 visas are eligible to work on campus for up to 20 hours per week while the term is in session and up to 40 hours per week between terms and summer vacations. Students who would like to participate in a paid off-campus academic internship during their degree program may be authorized for Curriculum Practical Training. F-1 international students in language training programs (including Pathway programs) are not eligible for employment or practical training.

Leadership Experience

It is also important to get leadership experience while you are in college. Employers hire students who have been involved in different activities on their campus or in their community. Oregon State University has a variety of clubs and organizations, so find one that is right for you, get involved and make your résumé stronger.

Career Development Center

The Career Development Center can help you develop résumé writing and interview skills and meet potential employers. They also can help eligible degree-seeking students find student employment.

Graduate Assistantships

Graduate students may be offered a teaching or research assistantship on campus. In exchange for their teaching or research service, students receive a monthly salary, tuition remission and an institutional contribution toward the health insurance program available only to graduate assistants. Teaching and research assistantships are offered on a competitive basis and are generally administered by the academic departments.

Working After Graduation

Oregon State University provides career support services from a variety of academic and administrative departments to help prepare you for your next steps after graduation. F-1 students who would like to gain practical work experience in their field of study may be authorized for Optional Practical Training. This authorization is usually to stay and work in the US for one year after graduation.
