STANDARD APPLICATION TO USC

The University of South Carolina offers world-class academics in a friendly, welcoming environment that attracts students from around the globe. In fact, more than 1600 international students from more than 100 countries are currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina. If you are proficient in English, you may wish to apply for direct entry into your program of interest using the university's standard application.

No matter what area of study you choose, you may also be interested in additionally applying for admission into the South Carolina Honors College, ranked #1 among all honors colleges in the nation. Selection into this prestigious college is highly competitive and requires completion of the supplemental honors form in USC's standard application (www.sc.edu/admissions).

Deadlines and Application Requirements

For deadlines and application details, please visit sc.edu/apply.

- 1. Complete application form and \$100 (USD) application fee.
- 2. Official TOEFL, IELTS, or PTE academic test scores. Some countries' citizens are exempt from language requirement.
- **3.** Official (or attested copy) transcript(s) from all high school records in your native language, and a certified transcript translated into English by a school official.
- 4. Professional credentials evaluation with a GPA reported on a U.S. grading scale.
- **5.** Submit official SAT or ACT scores (with writing section) if you are applying for admission to the South Carolina Honors College or want to be considered for any departmental scholarships.
- **6.** Submit financial certification if you are offered admission. You will need to demonstrate that you will have sufficient funding to attend the University of South Carolina for one academic year.

For international students, the move from high school in your home country to a university in the United States can be challenging—a new language, new ways of learning and a new home. 

- Acquire essential information for day-to-day life at USC as you navigate your immediate physical and emotional surroundings and immerse yourself deeper into the USC community.
- Become a well-rounded, autonomous learner by exploring the individual nature of learning and employing active-learning exercises to demonstrate effective learning strategies.
- Share your experiences, document your growth and articulate your personal, academic and professional goals through a capstone video project, while simultaneously building technical skills through the use of mixed-media tools and techniques.

Extended Accelerator Program (EAP)

The Extended Accelerator Program is a three-semester program for students seeking an immersive English-learning experience.

The program gives students a firsthand practical and cultural understanding of the University of South Carolina campus and Columbia area through its contextual curriculum. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

- An immersive educational experience with a contextual curriculum bridging language, culture and academics.
- **USC and the World** is a unique course designed for international students that will deepen your working knowledge of life in the United States and give you a comprehensive understanding of the local community and region.
- **Bolster your academic achievement** with turbocharged English-language instruction, tutoring, academic advising and student support.
- Benefit from personalized English-language instruction that's fully contextual—for example, lab-specific English-language instruction alongside your lab-science course.

Academic Accelerator Program (AAP)

The Academic Accelerator Program is a two-semester program designed specifically for students who are ready to succeed in immersive English-speaking classrooms, but who also want the benefit of English-language and student support that will help them thrive. The program curriculum offers a balance of university-wide and AAP-exclusive courses, with English-language course supplements that equip students with the practical, subject-specific vocabulary and skills they need to excel in their course work. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

- With just the right amount of support when you need it, the Academic Accelerator Program features a curriculum designed to accommodate your academic and English-language needs.
- Fully credit-bearing, so you can earn a full freshman year's worth of credits while taking courses tailored to your needs as an international student, helping you achieve your academic and career goals.
- English-language instruction designed around your social and academic needs; for example, you will be prepared specifically for the classes you will take, such as algebra and U.S. history.
- Integrated with open and closed courses, so you'll be in some classes with U.S. students and others with your designated Undergraduate Accelerator cohort.

Career Accelerator Program

Develop your professional presence and get a head start on your future! Participate in the Career Accelerator Program alongside the Undergraduate Accelerator and your degree, and you'll be heading for career success from day one. Whether you will be looking for a new job when you graduate, planning on returning to a previous employer or thinking about starting your own business, you will enhance your professional skills. In addition, you will gain skills proven to advance your academic performance, and work with a dedicated career counselor who will help you access opportunities for real-work placement in line with your career goals. These opportunities will be available to you during your degree or after graduation.

The Career Accelerator Program takes two years to complete and is tailored to the unique experience of international students. It'll help you develop the skills to stand out in a crowded global job market: you'll explore career interests, practice interview skills, develop a powerful résumé or CV and connect with employers and executives and build an impressive network of contacts.

To be eligible for internship placement assistance, students must:

- Successfully complete all required elements of the Career Accelerator Program
- Have at least a 3.3 GPA
- Have maintained appropriate immigration status in the United States
- Be eligible for off-campus work authorization via the ISS office

Once you begin the program, you will have access to advisors who will help you to successfully navigate these requirements.





TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. International Accelerator Program at the University of South Carolina (USC IAP) students should read these terms and conditions carefully prior to submitting an application. In addition to these terms and conditions, as students at University of South Carolina's (USC), all USC IAP students are bound by the rules and regulations governing USC, as those may be amended from time to time. The most recent USC rules can be found here: sc.edu/policies/policiesbydivision.php
- USC and USC IAP reserve the right to amend these terms and conditions from time to time. At all times, students will be required to comply with the then-current terms and conditions. The most current USC IAP terms and conditions can be found at www.uofsc.org/terms-and-conditions.
- 3. Application: Students may apply to the USC IAP (Extended, Academic or Integrated), USC Pe-Sessional English Language Program, or for direct admission to USC. If you decide to apply to any of these programs, be sure to use the application that is specific to the program you select. Each application contains terms & conditions governing the specific program and students acknowledge by submitting an application that they agree to the terms and conditions of the respective program. Links to applicable applications and terms and conditions can be found here: sc.edu/iap or sc.edu/admissions.
- 4. Transfer Credits: Students who have attempted any postsecondary credit prior to applying to the USC IAP are subject to additional review and admission requirements. Prior enrollment at any post-secondary institution and any postsecondary coursework attempted must be disclosed at the time of application to the USC IAP program. For admission to the IAP, students who have studied university-level courses after the completion of high school must meet current secondary school GPA requirements (US equivalent of a 2.5 secondary school GPA) as well as a 2.5 average GPA for all post-secondary college credits, regardless of whether they wish to transfer that credit. Students with more than 18 credits of transferrable credits are not eligible for the IAP. Vocational, diploma and ESL studies are not considered in the admissions review process. Transfer credits must be submitted to an accredited evaluation service (WES, SILNY) as soon as possible after acceptance into the IAP program. Transfer credits are articulated after completion of the IAP and may be used in determining progression requirements as well as admission to specific programs of study, and may apply toward academic degree requirements. Post-secondary coursework earned outside the USC IAP program will not apply to IAP program requirements. The student acknowledges that USC and the USC IAP make no representations and cannot guarantee that post-secondary college credits will be accepted.
- 5. Students who are admitted to the USC IAP will receive a written offer letter with details on accepting the offer, paying the program deposit and arriving
- 6. Tuition, fees, and accommodation payment: Following payment of the deposit, students must pay the remaining outstanding balance prior to the start date of the program. USC IAP has the right to amend prices due to university actions, tax increases, governmental actions or other events beyond its control. The payment deadlines are as follows:

- 7. Accommodation and Meal Plan: All USC IAP students are required to commit to a two or three term reservation (according to program length) in the USC residential hall and pay in full for these accommodations before move-in. All USC IAP students' housing commitments run two or three terms unless otherwise noted. If a USC IAP student is unable to live on campus, they must submit the USC IAP Housing Waiver form with an explanation when they send their official acceptance of their USC IAP offer, and this requirement will only be waived under extenuating circumstances. Once a student has moved into the residence hall, refunds are available only until the 15th day of class after the program start date. Refunds will be prorated through the 15th day of class. Students are also required to purchase an IAP-designated minimum fourteen (14) meal plan per week for two or three semesters, according to program length. The cost of the meal plan is non-refundable once the student has arrived on campus.
- 8. Health Insurance: All international students studying at USC are required to be covered by health insurance, which meets the U.S. Government, South Carolina State, and USC requirements.

- a. At the time of their application, students are required to purchase coverage from an IAP-designated health plan as a condition of enrollment (exceptions are only made for sponsored students who are provided with health insurance that has been approved by USC and USC IAP). The cost of health insurance is non-refundable once the student has arrived on campus. Not all services are covered, and the student is responsible for any outstanding balances for non-covered services.
- b. Prior to orientation, all students must have a completed USC Student Health Services Immunization Form documenting proof of immunity to Measles (Rubeola), Mumps and German Measles (Rubella) [MMR], and either proof of immunization against Meningitis and Hepatitis B, or a signed waiver declining these two vaccines. Mandatory Immunization Forms may be obtained through the USC Student Health Services website (http://www.sa.sc.edu/sh/forms/immunization/). Students must have immunization documentation to live on campus and prior to class start date.
- c. The cost of health insurance is not refundable.
- 9. Airport Transfers: Requests for airport transfer should be made at least 2 weeks in advance by visiting www.uofsc.org/welcome. Airport transfers are available for the student's initial arrival on campus for flights arriving at Columbia, SC. USC IAP cannot guarantee a reservation for a request made less than 2 weeks in advance, however, staff will make every attempt to accommodate late requests. In the event that a flight is canceled or delayed, students must call the emergency telephone number published in the Next Steps Brochure to inform IAP's staff of the new arrival date and time. Please see section 22 for airport transfer cancellation policy.
- 10. Cancellation, Change, Curtailment or Withdrawal: Students who cancel their USC IAP course prior to arrival on USC's campus may request a full refund of deposit, tuition and fees. Students will only be eligible for a refund if they submit documentation of visa denial with written notification to USC IAP prior to the course start date. After completing your fourth week of classes in your first semester of your IAP program, there will be no refunds for the remainder of the IAP program duration absent exceptional circumstances. IAP summer semesters are subject to shorter refund periods; refer to the table below. After the start of the IAP program, students may be eligible for the following refunds:

- 11. Holidays and Closures: The IAP program adheres to the university schedule for holidays and campus closures. Refer to the academic calendar published by the Office of the Registrar: http://registrar.sc.edu/html/calendar/5YrCalendar3.stm and the holiday schedule approved by the Division of Human Resources: https://www.sc.edu/about/offices_and_divisions/human_resources/benefits/time_away/holidays/. Students should also monitor Carolina Alert for information on emergency closures due to inclement weather or other emergency situations: http://sc.edu/carolinaalert/. In the event of an emergency closure, faculty and students are expected to make up for the lost class time and complete all course requirements. There are no refunds for time lost due to holidays or emergency closures.
- 12. Absences: F1 students must comply with all applicable United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) regulations related to study on a student visa at USC, including attendance requirements, as well as the university and course instructor attendance policies indicated in the course syllabus. Failure to meet attendance requirements may lead to penalties, including loss of immigration status, as well as unsatisfactory course grades due to excessive absences. Any student who is absent during the program or loses immigration status due to absences will not be eligible for a refund.
- 13. Academic Criteria: Students are accepted into the USC IAP with the strict understanding that progression through the USC IAP and successful completion of any program will require satisfactory attendance and successful attainment of specified progression grades. Students in the Academic Accelerator Program and Extended Accelerator Program must meet transfer requirements before progressing to sophomore degree-seeking study at USC. Students who do not meet direct admission English proficiency requirements must also pass their English as a Second Language (ESL) courses with a C or better. Students who do not pass their ESL courses will either be required to repeat the term, repeat the course, or have additional remediation in the following term at an additional cost. Students who do not meet the criteria for successful completion will not be allowed to proceed. Students may be offered advice on suitable alternative options, which may or may not include retaking courses, repeating certain courses or pursuing a different major. These alternative options may involve additional time and costs, including tuition and accommodation fees.
- 14. Academic Resources: all books and learning materials need to be purchased by IAP students upon arrival at USC.
- 15. Student Conduct: All USC IAP students are required to follow USC spolicies, rules, and regulations. Any student who commits a criminal offense, violates campus rules, has poor attendance, or fails to meet program requirements may be expelled or suspended. No refund will be given in cases of expulsion. USC s Student Code of Conduct (http://www.sc.edu/policies/ppm/staf626.pdf) provides a framework of standard acceptable behavior for students. Students are responsible for understanding and complying with these policies. All refunds will be made to eligible parties within 45 days of written notice.

- 20. Force majeure: USC and the USC IAP will not be liable in cases where USC and/or USC IAP is unable to fulfill any services because of fire, natural disaster, national emergency, act of government, acts of war or terrorism, failure of suppliers or subcontractors, labor disputes or any other reasons which are beyond USC's or IAP's control.
- 21. F-1 student status in the US: In order to maintain proper F-1 status, students must comply with all applicable Federal and South Carolina State regulations as well as University policy related to study in the United States, including pursuit of a full course of study. Students who fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress are in jeopardy of losing immigration status. Any violation of student status will be reported in the SEVIS database shared by USC and the Department of Homeland Security. Information collected by USC and the IAP which personally identifies a student and information regarding a student's course progress may be shared with Department of Homeland Security, state and accrediting agencies, designated authorities, and during the time of participation in the IAP program students' parents, recruiters, sponsors, and USC and IAP staff and representatives as well. This information may include personal and contact details, course enrollment details and changes, and circumstances of any suspected breach by the student of any USC or IAP policies and/or any DHS rules or regulations.
- 22. Cancellation: «Cancellation Period» refers to the period up to the start date of the first course you are attending. Cancellations must be made during the Cancellation Period in writing and in these cases, provided the student never attends, 100% of the tuition and accommodation fees will be refunded. In all cases, the enrollment fee and any other service charges (e.g. accommodation fee, airport transfer fee, medical insurance, campus fee, program supplement fee, etc.) are non-refundable. Please see Section 6 for accommodation cancellation policy and Section 9 for cancellations after the Cancellation Period. Any dispute, claim or other matter arising will be subject to the jurisdiction and laws of the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina. By signing these terms and conditions, the student consents to and accepts the jurisdiction of such court for the purpose of any such action or proceeding and agrees to waive any objection of venue being laid therein.
- 24. In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), the undersigned student hereby permits USC and USC IAP to disclose personally identifiable information, including educational records, financial information and, attendance records to the IAP, its operator, International Accelerator Program at the University of South Carolina, LLC, its parent Shorelight Education, LLC, and their group companies (the "Operator"). The undersigned hereby also grants USC and the IAP Operator permission to provide the student's parent(s), guardian(s), sponsor(s) and recruiter(s) with information pertaining to their application, academic progress, results and attendance. These permissions will remain in effect during the undersigned student's tenure at IAP.
- 25. Students must be 16 years old by the move-in date (January 6, 2016 for spring intake; May 8, 2016 for summer intake; August 10, 2016 for fall intake) in order to participate in the program. Students who are over the age of 16 but under the age of 18 will be required to obtain the signature and consent of a parent or guardian before they are able to participate in the program.
